PURPOSE:	The Wildlife Intern will identify subsistence use areas on the map and collect data on sea and land animals including but not limited to species of fish and waterfowls harvested by the tribal members. If circumstances permit the Wildlife Intern will work concurrently work with other local Fish and Wildlife agencies. The Wildlife Intern will have designated subsistence use areas that he/she will observe and document on regular basis. He/she must be able to understand the needs of Inupiat values and culture. His/her other duty is to help monitor our annual whaling and other renewable resources within the designated areas as required.		
<b>DUTIES:</b> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Must be knowledgeable in cultural and traditional uses of subsistence resources and their uses.</li> <li>2. Must be able to speak and understand Inupiat language and be able to provide data written reports for NVB and other agencies that may request them.</li> <li>3. Must be knowledgeable of State and Federal regulations to protect our natural resources habitats in the North Slope region.</li> <li>4. Must be able to conduct interviews with native and non-native on migratory patterns of caribou, waterfowls, sea mammals and fish on a designated are of the map.</li> <li>5. Should be able to understand and read maps as necessary to point out our historical landmark sites so that others may be aware of them.</li> <li>6. Must be able to understand weather conditions and lead or instruct others to protect themselves if weather conditions suddenly change.</li> <li>7. Must be able to operate and have working knowledge on VHF or CB radios.</li> <li>8. Ability to perform physically demanding work and withstand inclement weather and other uncomfortable environmental conditions. An average of six (6) hours will be spent out in the field daily.</li> </ol>
