The Wildlife Subsistence Resource Technician Assistant must be able to understand the needs of Inupiat values and culture. His/her other duty is to assist the Wildlife Subsistence Resource Technician in monitoring our annual whaling and other renewable resources within the designated areas as required.

5. Ability to work carefully and safely with large and small game animals and safely Operate small boats, snowmobiles, power tools and other field and research equipment.
